I want to give a personal THANK YOU to Dawn and Joellyn for all the work, effort and energy you both provided the Guild this past year, it did not go unnoticed!!!

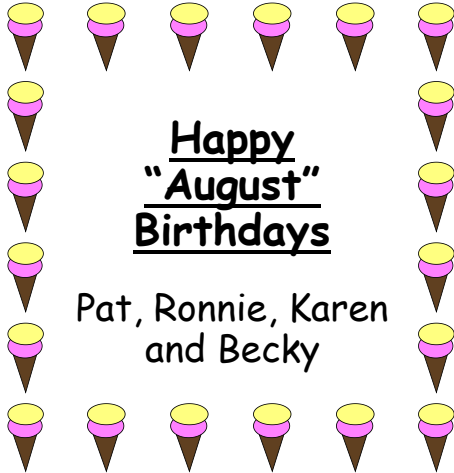
